Baudji (Bahudi), Baudji-wadata, Gesua, Dimadebu, Naidate, Sihadate, Iteadate, Ketaura, Ariki, Siwodate, Wokidate, Diruaki, Demita, Wohidate. Op de berghellingen ten Zuiden van de Gesa-rivier. (? zielen).

... People living on the eastern banks of the Mamberamo, from the Bagoosa in the north to the Kwerba in the south / speak the same language. This language is also spoken by the people in the southern hinterland of Sarmi, from the village of Muremar_w to the village of Messentefereh on the eastern bank of the Tor River. This large language area ... includes people such as the Kaowerabeedj, Aurauweedj, Metaweedj, Murenjerwa, Airmati, Segar, and many others. There are some minor differences in dialect, but these are so slight that the people themselves are not aware

of them,. . .

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Somewhat south of Pionier-Bivak, in a kitchen garden along the river, a group of Baudji were encountered from the Baudji settlements at Lake Telaga Biru. Their language is quite different from the Mamberamo-Apauwer languages, and they have connections with the tribes in the Warim area far inland. The Baudji are an extensive group, consisting of three different tribes, but only members of the Telaga Biru tribe have on various occasions been contacted by Europeans. . . .

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BAUZI

Bauzi is spoken by an estimated 1000 people living in approximately twelve villages located north of Buremeso on the Mamberamo River, to Bili in the south. A partial listing of village names is located in the map below.

The Bauzi people number around 1500. Their borders extend generally from the Mamberamo River westward, and as far south as the Lakes Plain region of Irian Jaya, Indonesia. . . .

The Bauzi are a group of about 1500 hunter-gatherers scattered around the Mamberamo area of Irian Jaya, still largely practicing the lifestyle handed down for generations. Outside contact began for them in the early 1970's with the entrance of Christian teachers from the highlands and expatriate missionaries from the Regions Beyond Missionary Union. They are animists and although nomadic, are now turning to more permanent villages in areas where contact with outsiders has been steady, and are starting to make gardens.

The Bauzi are a group of some 1500 semi-nomadic hunting and gathering people, whose territory extends westward from the Mamberamo River to the North coast and as far south as the Lakes Plain region in Irian Jaya, ... Bauzi is a non-Austronesian language, classified as belonging to the Geelvink Bay phylum, East Geelvink Bay Stock-level Family. (Voorhoeve, C.L., 1975:51)

Up until recent years the Bauzi customarily built isolated homesteads along an extensive river system throughout their territory. A portion of the population are still based in these isolated single family shelters; in other areas longhouses are used. During the 1970's and the 1980's, a number of Bauzi grouped together at seven village locations, but continue their semi-nomadic subsistence patterns, using the village as a base of operations and a location for planting bananas, taro, and tapioca -- their main staples along with jungle roots and fruits. ...

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The languages that abut on the Warembori range are, from east, curving to the south, to west, the Yoke (Warembori: Patero) in Mantarbori and the hinterland inland as far as Lake Rombebai, the Bagusa (Warembori: Putampa), who have now expanded north as far as Lake Rombebai, various small languages related to Bauzi (such as Anasi, spoken up the river on which Tamakuri is located, approximately two days' paddling away), and Kurudu to the west (technically not contiguous, since a large stretch of mangrove exists between Bonoi and Poiwai, the easternmost of the two islands where Kurudu is spoken). Of these, only Kurudu is Austronesian; Yoke is related to Warembori (in the Lower Mamberamo family); Bagusa is a variety of western Kwerba, and

Anasi is related to Bauzi (Warembori: Bakuseria) and other languages of the hinterland between the Waropen coast and the Mamberamo.

Apart from Yoke, there is a considerable stretch of uninhabited (and uninhabitable) territory between the Warembori and their neighbours. ...

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(BAURI)

Taru_gare is spoken near the township of Nabire at the bottom of the Geelvink Bay; Baropasi is located about 200 km north-west of Nabire, and Bauri is spoken near Lake Holmes in the mountains south-east of Baropasi. The exact areas covered by them, and their numbers of speakers are not known, and it is possible that there are still other languages belonging to the same family in the same general area -- the figure of 3,000 speakers or so may perhaps be not too far from the mark.
