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(NGALIK, SOUTH)

From the Elu creek in the Pasema area on the southwest side of the Balim gorge up the gorge to the Samenage river, up the south side of that river and over the range through all the Mvba or Moba watershed, the Wusak or upper Lorentz and probably the Hela and Wylygy valleys, a chain of languages or dialects are spoken. These languages or dialects and their inter-relationships are not yet adequately known. Speakers of these languages or dialects apparently recognize most if not all of

them as 'our language', and all may be dialects of a single language for which no single label is widely used. / The term south Ngalik is simply a specification and application of the Lower Grand Valley term for the languages and cultures outside the ranges along the Balim valley.
