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West of the Pauwasi Phylum only small isolated languages are found till one reaches the Nawa River. They are Molof (200 speakers), Usku (20 speakers) and Tofamna (number of speakers unknown). ...

Tofamna, spoken by an unknown number of people living near the Nawa River, to the east of Usku.
