

WOLANI

Met de Wolani's of Boani's heeft men een zelfde merkwaardigheid: volgens de Moni's ... zouden de Wolani's geen Moni's, maar Kapaoekoes zijn ...

De bevolking zelf zegt echter geen "Kapaoekoe" te zijn, ook geen Moni, maar Boani. De Gouvernements Indische Arts Adang Roushdy meent de Boani's evenals de Siriwo-"Kapaoekoe" tot de Moni's te mogen rekenen. ...

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... The Moni Tribe, or Moni Language, is a general term, used by non-Moni to indicate the people or language of the following clans, namely, Migani, Wolani, Zoenggoenoe.

...

The Migani, Wolani and Zoenggoenoe undoubtedly originated from one common source or root language, ... While each of the 3 above dialects of the Moni language have peculiarities of their own, the natives have no difficulty whatsoever in understanding one another. A knowledge of the Migani dialect would enable one to be understood in the Wolani and Zoenggoenoe language areas.

The Wolani people are located mostly in the Biandora Valley. Some are found in the lower reaches of the Kemandora Valley and in the area immediately north of Biandora. ...

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WODANI

(Wolani of **Woda-mo**)

De Ekagi noemt zichzelf "mens" en onderscheidt als tegenstelling "andere mensen", anders in taal en zeden. Voor deze andere mensen heeft hij een aparte naam, zoals Mou (voor de Moni's), Wada Mou (voor de Wolani's), Ogito (voor de Uhunduni's), Kajaa (voor de Ndani's). Omgekeerd hebben de andere stammen een naam voor de Ekagi's, voor zover ze daarmee in nabij of ver contact staan en van hun bestaan afweten.
